INDEPENDENT SCHOOLS AUSTRALIA WELCOMES DR MICHELE BRUNIGES AS AITSL CHAIR

Independent Schools Australia (ISA) welcomes the appointment of Dr Michele Bruniges AM as the new Chair of the Australian Institute for Teaching and School Leadership (AITSL) by Education Minister Jason Clare.

ISA Chief Executive Officer Mr Graham Catt congratulated Dr Bruniges on her appointment as Chair of AITSL.

"Dr Bruniges brings more than 40 years' experience as a teacher and senior government administrator to this important role," Mr Catt said.

"After working as a teacher in the NSW public school system, TAFE and the Adult Migrant Education Service, she was appointed to lead the ACT Department of Education and Training, NSW Department of Education and Communities and the Australian Government Department of Education as Secretary of Education.
