## FORUM NEXT WEEK ON RE-ENGAGING STUDENTS

On 7 November, Independent Schools Australia (ISA) will host a forum at Australian Parliament House to discuss ways that special assistance schools re-engage students in education. These schools work with some of Australia's most at risk and disadvantaged students, creating pathways to employment or further education, and often turning around young people's lives.

Principals and educators will join key stakeholders from around Australia, sharing creative approaches to address school refusal and disruption, responses to teacher workforce shortage and providing inclusive places of learning for Indigenous students.
